




Developing Notation Skills

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Accompaniment	An instrumental or vocal part designed to support or complement a
Beat	The beat is the basic unit of time.
Chant	A repeated rhythmic phrase, typically one shouted or sung in unison by a crowd.
Chorus	A part of a song which is repeated after each verse.
Compose	The art of creating music, or the finished product.
Drone	A drone is a harmonic or monophonic effect or accompaniment where a note or chord is continuously sounded throughout most or all of a piece.
Layer	Layering is the process of combining multiple individual sounds to create a cohesive sound that is more complex and interesting
Melody	A sequence of single notes that is musically satisfying; a tune.
Notation	Visual record of heard or imagined musical sound
Ostinato	An ostinato is a musical figure that repeats over and over again.
Rhythm	A strong, regular repeated pattern of movement or sound.
Round	A round is a form of composition in which each singer or instrumentalist carries the same melody, but begins and ends at different points.
Score	A written form of a musical composition; parts for different instruments appear on separate staves on large pages.
The Stave	A set of five parallel lines on any one or between any adjacent two of which a note is written to indicate its pitch.
Tone	A vocal or instrumental sound that denotes its pitch, relevant to where it is on the musical scale
Unison	Simultaneous performance or utterance of action or speech.
Verse	A repeated section of a song that typically features a new set of lyrics on each repetition.
