Key Vocabulary	
Stereotype	Stereotypes are ideas about how people will act, based on the group they belong to. For example thinking that all girls like pink or all old people are weak
Gender	Having either male or female traits
Discrimination	Treating a person or particular group of people differently, especially in a worse way than you would treat other people, because of their gender, skin colour, age, religion etc.
Hazard	Something that is dangerous and likely to cause harm or injury.
Pressure	Trying to make someone else do something.
Genitals	The private parts of the male and female body - penis, testicles, vagina, vulva.
Inappropriate touch	Any form of touch that <b>makes you feel uncomfortable</b> - for instance, if someone attempts to forcefully hold your hand or tries to touch any part of your body or even tries to hug you without your consent-can be termed as inappropriate touching.
Casualty	A person who is ill or injured.



1. Check for danger
  - Always make sure the area is safe

2. Call 999/111
  - If it is an emergency, call 999 or 112. Remember LIONEL to give them important details



3. Reassure casualty
  - Keep the casualty reassured
  - Stay with them until help arrives



4. If you have been taught any first aid which may be useful, then use it

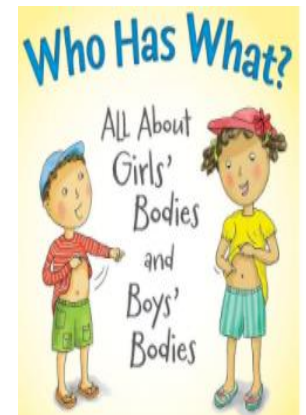
