Settlements

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Agricultural	Farming land
City	A city is a large urban area where lots of people live close to each other; there are often lots of shops and services in a city.
Dense population	Many people living in an area, homes are close to one another
Hamlet	A small settlement with a very small number of homes and no services
Industrial	Land used for factories or warehouses.
Population	The amount of people that live in an area.
Residential	Land used for housing
Rural	An area located outside of towns and cities, sometimes called the countryside: people often live far apart in rural areas
Settlement	A place where people live
Sparse population	Few people living in an area, homes are spread out.
Suburban	An area on the edges of towns and cities where people live: suburban areas often have green space and homes often have gardens
Town	A place where there are lots of houses and shops; a town may have a local council that makes decisions for the people who live there.
Urban	An area where a large number of people live near to each other: urban areas have lots of buildings and roads.
Village	A group of homes in the countryside, sometimes with a church and small shop


Rural area

It has a cathedral. Historically, cities were settlements with a cathedral, and those places remain cities.



Settlement hierarchy

City	100'000-300'000 people	A city would have a wide range of services but not as many as a large city.
Town	1,000-20,000	Towns see an increase in services, for example, they would have senior schools and police stations
Village	100-1000 people	Villages start to have some basic services like a petrol station or a village shop.
Hamlet	< 100 people	Hamlets have very tiny populations and few services, if any.
