Beat	The basic unit of time in music.
Composition	To create a piece of music and usually record it so it can be repeated.
Dynamics	How loud or quiet the music is.
Improvisation	To compose in the moment or make up as you go along.
Kwela	Kwela music is a genre of music that originated in southern Africa in the 1950s. It is based on the pennywhistle, a cheap and portable instrument that was used by street musicians to play catchy tunes with a jazzy and skiffle-like beat.
Pitch	How high or low a note is.
Рор	A pop song is a type of song that is popular and widely appealing to a large audience. Pop songs usually have catchy melodies, simple lyrics, and a verse-chorus structure.
Pulse	A steady beat that doesn't change. The heartbeat of the music.
Rhythm	How notes of different length are arranged into a pattern.
Structure	The way a piece of music is made up.
Tempo	How fast or slow the music is.

Listening: Find the pulse as you are listening to the music: You can pretend to be lots of different animals when you are finding the pulse of the music.



Improvisation

Improvisation is where you make up your own tunes on the spot. This can be done using musical instruments, voices or clapping. Improvisation is not written down and is a tune that has not been heard before. Everyone can improvise and it can be done individually or with other people.
