### Football:



The pitch is split into two halves with a centre circle and two areas where the GKs can use their hands to catch or save the ball.

**Positions/Tactics:** Certain players will be better at certain skills which will help decide what position they play: GK, DEF, MID, ATT are the main positions. Tactically in a game you need a balance of positions, not all of the team can be attackers.

**GK:** Goal Keeper **DEF:** Defence **MID:** Mid Field **ATT:** Attack

**Shooting:** In order to win a game, you need to score goals, usually by shooting at the goal. Being able to shoot accurately and powerfully is a perfect recipe for success! Aiming away from the goal keeper and into the corners of the net give the best chance for scoring a goal.

### Orienteering:

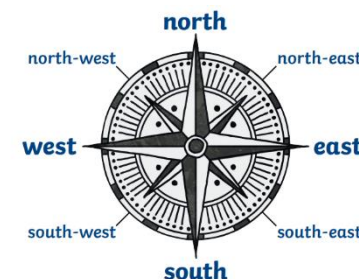
Using basic map skills, including direction, key and navigation.
