Key Vocabulary	Definition
Agriculture	The science of farming, includes growing crops and rearing animals.
Arable	Growing crops for farming.
City	A place where many people live closely together.
Coastal erosion	The process of the coastline being worn away by destructive waves
Coastline	The line of the coast where the land meets the sea.
Country	A land that is controlled by a single government.
County	Areas that have their own councils who make decisions about local issues.
Gulf stream	A current of warm water that moves across the Atlantic Ocean before reaching the South West of England
Jurassic	A period of time in History when dinosaurs ruled the land.
Moor	A large area of land where crops are grown, often covered in Heather.
Pastoral	Raising animals for farming.
Pre-historic	Refers to times before written history.
Region	An area of land that has common features.
Tourism	When people travel to an area for a holiday.

How does erosion change the coastline?

- 1: Caves can form where there is a weakness or crack in the rock.
- 2: Erosion may cause the cave to extend through the headland to form an arch
- 3: Over time, the archway may collapse.
- 4: A stack is left.
- 5: This further erodes to leave a stump.
