Easter Sunday

Easter Traditions

Many Christians go to Church at Easter. Hot cross buns are eaten. The cross reminds people that Jesus died on the cross.



Many Christians send Easter cards and Simnel cake is eaten. It is a fruit cake with 11 marzipan balls on top. These represent all of the disciples except Judas.



Eggs are painted and chocolate eggs are given. The eggs symbolise new life and are the same shape as the rock that was put in front of Jesus' tomb.
