Suffixes

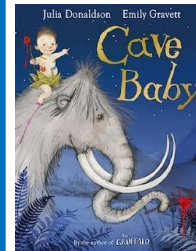
A suffix is a group of letters which go on the end of a word to create a new meaning. The suffixes we will be focusing on are *s/es*, *ing*, *ed*, *er* and *est*:

help—helps run—running join—joined
loud—louder fast—fastest
