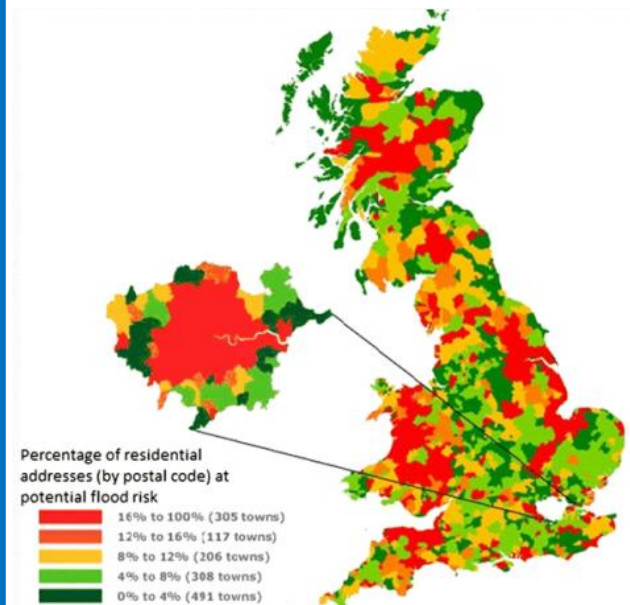

British Geographical Issues: Air Pollution, Climate Change and Waste

Key Vocabulary	Definition
air pollution	A mixture of synthetic and natural substances in the air.
climate change	A change in climate patterns in a region caused by increased levels of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere.
consumption	The action of using up a resource.
DEFRA	Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (UK government department)
emissions	The production and discharge of something e.g. exhaust fumes from vehicles.
environment	The surroundings or conditions in which a person, animal or plant lives or operates.
landfill	Disposal of waste material by burying it, especially as a method of filling and reclaiming excavated pits.
litter	Waste left in open, public places.
particles	A very tiny portion of matter, often smaller than the eye can see.
recycling	A process by which waste material can be used again.
refuse	The worthless or useless parts of something.
synthetic	Made by people, not a naturally occurring substance.
waste	Materials that are unwanted, or unusable and are disposed of.

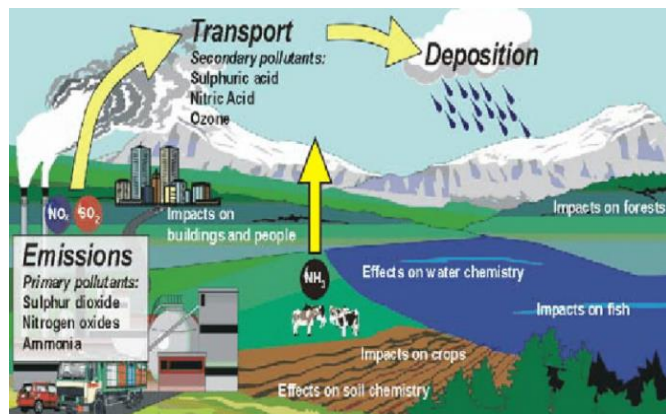
