The Wars of the Roses

The Wars of the Roses was a civil war fought in England. It lasted for just over 30 years from 1455 to 1487, however, the battles were mostly small and sometimes were years apart. The battles were fought between two rival families who both laid claim to the throne of England: The House of Lancaster and the House of York.

King Henry VI 1422 - 1461 24 year reign





Henry VI had poor periods of mental health, he was replaced by Richard, Duke of York. King Edward V 1483 2 month reign





King Edward V was the son of the Duke of York. He defeated Henry VI and became King. Henry VI reclaimed the throne from him.

King Edward IV 1461-1483 22 year reign





Edward IV reclaimed the throne after defeating Henry VI at Tewkesbury.

King Richard III 1483-1485 2 year reign





Uncle of Edward V. He became king after his nephews mysteriously disappeared.
