Vocabulary

Bunting	A strong structure that gives you a way to get across an obstacle like water.
Accurate	Neat, correct size, shape and pattern with no mistakes.
Sew	To join or fasten by stitches made by needle and thread.
Running-stitch	A simple style of sewing in a straight line with no overlapping.
Template	A stencil you use to draw a shape more easily onto a different materials.
Fabric	A natural or man-made woven or knitted material.
Knot	A join made by tying two pieces of string, thread or rope together.
Evaluate	To judge and discuss the outcome and how something went.
Stencil	A shape that you can draw around.

Remember to plan where your stitches will go on the pouch **template**.



When cutting the **template** out, be careful and as **accurate** as possible.
