


. Writing in the past tense

When you write in the past tense, you are writing about something that has already happened, and all the verbs must be in the past tense.

E.g. The dangerous wolf **ran** into the woods. He **looked** carefully for grandmother's cottage.

Verb	Simple past	Past progressive
run	ran	was running
look	looked	was looking

Key Vocabulary	Definition
<i>adjective</i>	A word that describes the noun.
<i>adverb</i>	A word that describes the verb.
<i>captions</i>	Phrases or sentences that explain what is shown on a picture.
<i>evil</i>	Very bad, wicked.
<i>gentle</i>	To have or show a mild, kind or tender temperament or character.
<i>glossary</i>	Explains what key words from the text mean.
<i>hairy</i>	Covered with hair.
<i>index page</i>	Found at the back. Lists important words in alphabetical order.
<i>photograph</i>	Pictures shown in the text to show you what things look like.
<i>sequel</i>	A second (or subsequent) piece of writing that continues the story or develops the theme of the earlier one.
<i>sub heading</i>	Mini titles that show what a specific section is about.
<i>wolves</i>	A wild, carnivorous mammal. The largest member of the dog family.

Features of Non-Chronological Reports

The key-features to include when writing a non-chronological report are:

Feature	Example
Title	Wolves
An introduction	Wolves are evil, fearsome creatures who lurk in dark places, ready to pounce on their prey. But are they really as horrible as fairy tales suggest?
Subheadings	What do Wolves Look Like?
Facts	Hairy wolves live in packs and hunt their prey together.
An 'interesting fact' box	Did you know? Carnivorous wolves have 42 teeth to tear the flesh from their prey.
