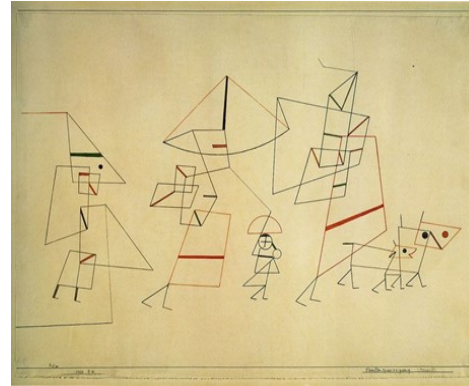

#### Vocabulary:

Line	A long thin mark on a surface
Straight	Not in a curve or at an angle
Zigzag	a line or pattern that looks like a series of letter W's as it bends to the left and then to the right again.
Wavy	Having curves. Not straight
Curved	Having a round shape
Thick	Having a larger distance between opposite sides
Loop	A shape like a curve or circle made by a line curving right round.

Joan Miro and Paul Klee are both artists who use line in their work.

Miro used curved lines in his work and Klee used straight lines in his.



A line is a mark made on a surface that joins different points. Lines can vary in length, be thick or thin and can be different shapes and go in different directions. There are many types of line including thick, thin, horizontal, vertical, zigzag, diagonal, curvy, looped etc... and are often very expressive. Lines are basic tools for artists and some artists show their lines more than others. Using lines in drawings is known as Line Art. In Line Art the lines can be done in any colour, although it is most common for the drawings to be black and white. Line Art can be simple or complex.
