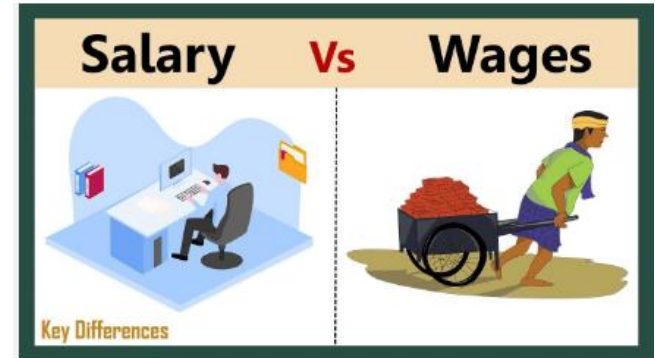

What jobs do people have?

Key Vocabulary	Definition
community	A group of people living in the same place.
employment	Being employed. Having something to do, usually a job.
job	Something done for money. To carry out activities that will help others.
occupation	The work a person does to earn money, which is often called a job or profession.
responsibility	Being in charge of something. Having control over something or someone.
role	The part of something that you do.
salary	Money that is earned by doing a job. Being paid weekly or monthly.
shops	Places you can go to buy things.
similar	Things are alike or have features that are the same.
strength	Something you are good at.
trait	Something about you that makes you 'you'.
wages	Money that is earned by doing a job. Being paid by the hour.
weakness	Something you find difficult or tricky.
workplace	The place people go to every day to carry out their work.

What is the difference between a salary and wages?



A salary is paid either weekly or monthly, whereas wages are paid hourly. People who are paid a salary get paid the same amount every week or month, regardless of how many hours they work. People with wages are paid for the actual number of hours they work.

There are many different places people can go to work. A teacher works in a school; a baker works in a bakery; and the police work at a police station. If we wanted to buy some fresh food, we could go to Tesco or Aldi where lots of people work.
