How can I be a good citizen?

Diverse community

Living in a diverse community means that we are surrounded by several different cultures and experiences.



Key Vocabulary	Definition
citizen	Someone who lives in a particular place.
citizenship	If someone wants to live permanently in another country, they can apply for citizenship. This means they must pass a test to be allowed to stay.
community	A group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common
contributions	A gift or payment to a common fund or collection.
culture	The ideas, customs, and social behaviour of a particular people or society.
discrimination	Discrimination means to treat a person or group of people unfairly, especially on the basis of certain characteristics, such as race, religion, age, sex, disability or gender.
diversity	A range of different things.
prejudice	A preconceived opinion that is not based on reason or actual experience
segregated	Separated or divided along racial, sexual, or religious lines.
society	The aggregate of people living together in a more or less ordered community.
stereotype	A stereotype is a fixed, oversimplified idea about a particular type of person or thing. Stereotypes are often harmful to the people or things they refer to.

Discrimination

It should not happen, but people can be discriminated by their age, gender, race, religion and disability.



Segregation

Segregation is the separation of people because of their race, gender or religion.



Citizen

The word 'citizen' comes from the early French word 'citeien' meaning 'town'. A citizen is someone who lives in a particular area or belongs to a country such as the United Kingdom. Citizens often live in groups called communities. Communities are groups of people who live in the same place or have something in common.
