### The Ten Commandments

### Communion

Communion, also known as the Eucharist or the Lord's Supper, is a religious practice in Christianity. It involves the symbolic consumption of bread and wine, which represent the body and blood of Jesus Christ. Participants typically receive communion during a church service as a way to remember Jesus' sacrifice and to strengthen their spiritual connection with Him and fellow believers.

### Love thy neighbour

Martin Luther King Jr. exemplified the principle of "loving thy neighbour" through his advocacy for civil rights and social justice. He promoted nonviolent resistance and preached love and understanding, even in the face of hatred and oppression.



Mother Teresa exemplified the principle of "loving thy neighbour" through her life dedicated to serving the poorest of the poor. She founded the Missionaries of Charity, an organization that provided care and support to those in need.
