### Verb Tenses

In English there is the past, present and future tense.

The past tense is something that has already happened,

the present tense is something that is happening right now and the future tense is something that has not yet happened.



Key Vocabulary	Definition
<b>amazed</b>	To surprise greatly or fill with wonder; astonish.
<b>ancient</b>	Belonging to the very distant past and no longer in existence.
<b>architect</b>	A person who designs and plans buildings.
<b>conjunction</b>	A word that connects clauses or sentences. E.g. and, if, but, because.
<b>curious</b>	Eager to learn or know.
<b>imperative (bossy) verb</b>	A 'bossy' verb that when placed at the beginning of a sentence tells you to do something.
<b>noun</b>	A person, place or object.
<b>proper noun</b>	A name used for an individual person, place, or organisation, spelled with an initial capital letter.
<b>samba</b>	A Brazilian dance of African origin.
<b>sorrowful</b>	Experiencing sorrow; sad.
<b>verb</b>	An action or a doing word.

### Command sentences

Command sentences are used when you are telling someone to do something.

Commands usually start with an imperative verb, also known as a 'bossy verb', because they tell someone to do something.

"Fetch me some biscuits."

In this example, 'fetch' is the imperative verb.

You should also use commands when you are writing instructions telling someone how to do something.

### Superlative Adjectives

Superlatives describe something at the very extreme end of a scale.

Happy - Happiest

Late - Latest

Hairy - Hairiest

Big - Biggest

Lonely - Loneliest

Scary - Scariest

### Synonym
