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Please see the following information about some support that may be beneficial to you.

The Cake Initiative -

If you are struggling to make ends meet around your child's birthday, please reach out to <u>https://cake-initiative.org.uk/#request</u>. Please note: they require at least 2 weeks' notice to fulfil an order. Regrettably, at this point in time, they are unable to cater for children with allergies.

The Harvest Centre -

Allows residents 1 free food parcel a month, just pop in or email the harvest centre on foodparcels@theharvest centre.com with your name and address and how many people are in the household. When collecting your food parcel, you do need to bring your own bags. Collection is on Tuesdays from 11:00am to 1:00pm.

Zebras Children And Adults Charity -

Have a weekly fruit and veg dropin which is in partnership with the Royal British Legion on Wednesdays from 9.30-11am. If you are in need of a free bag of fruit and vegetables then please do go along. The fruit and veg is only there until its gone, so please do arrive earlier if you can to avoid disappointment.

Brandon Church Institute -

Has food left over from Tesco, the surplus is left in the foyer of the Church Institute. This can be daily sometimes.

We also have a contact there that can provide food parcels all we need is for you to message us with your na me and contact details for us to pass on.

Free School Meals -

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you receive any of the following:





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- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Suffolk Local Welfare Assistance Scheme (LWAS) -

To receive help from LWAS you must:

- Be able to demonstrate you are in financial hardship
- Live in Suffolk
- Be 16-years old or over
- Not be subject to immigration control or have no recourse to public funds
- Have a combined household income of £27,500 a year or less?
- Have less than £1,500 available in savings across the household
- Have not made an application in the previous 6 months

They will look at your income and savings. If you have adequate savings to meet your basic living needs, your application will be declined.
